***Instructions for writing competition**

- The topic(s) for the writing competition will be announced on the spot.
- The medium of writing shall be Sanskrit / English / Bengali
- Mixing of languages is not permitted.
- Any form of copying, plagiarism, or unfair means will lead to immediate disqualification.
- The time limit for the competition will be one hour.
- The word limit shall be within 1000 words.
- Participants must bring their own writing materials.
- The answer script must clearly mention the Name, Department, Semester, and Roll Number of the participant.
- Evaluation will be based on content, originality, clarity of expression, and overall presentation. Names of the winners will be announced on 6th of January 2026.
